This program involves the World Health Organization in collaboration with the International Organization on Migration, the United Nations Population Fund and the United Nations Children's Fund. Lao PDR	Promoting basic WASH services with gender-segregated toilets in Lao PDR	This is a multi-programmatic intervention that served to support the country in the building of over 100 gender-separated toilets. This program is by the World Health Organization Environmental Health team and Health Information and Management team, in partnership with the Lao National Center for Water and Environmental Health and the Lao Ministry of Health. Lao PDR	Generating evidence on improving community engagement to increase the uptake of essential health care	This program educates and supports pregnant women in rural areas to have access to antenatal care and delivery in hospitals, building their relationship with health centres. This program is by the Malaysian Department of Health, in collaboration with the Department of Orang Asli Development and the local departments of education and forestry. Philippines	'We are the community': Scaling up pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) through community-based organizations in the Philippines	This program serves groups at substantial risk from HIV infection (men who have sex with men and transgender women). This program is in collaboration with a community based organization, the Research Institute of Tropical Medicine, the World Health Organization and the Foundation for AIDS Research. Philippines	"Reaching Every Purok" (Reaching every community with maternal and newborn health education in Maco)	This program utilises health service providers - Barangay health workers, midwives, and nurses - to track pregnant women and provide basic laboratory services including urinalysis, blood sugar, and haemoglobin checks, as well as dispensing of iron supplements, education and counselling. Philippines	Increasing uptake of COVID-19 vaccines by creating safe and protective spaces for women and children experiencing homelessness in the Philippines	This program aimed to improve vaccinations among women at-risk/experiencing homelessness. This program is by the World Health Organization country office, in collaboration with existing civil society networks and the Philippines Department of Health's Health Promotion team. Vietnam	High prevalence of HIV, syphilis and HCV among key populations and partners: results from an integrated multiple diseases testing led by community in Vietnam	This program targets people who inject drugs, men who have sex with men, sex workers and their partners through multi-testing services. This program is in collaboration with the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria and the Unified Budget, Results and Accountability Framework through the World Health Organization. Vietnam	Essential Services Package for Women and Girls Subject to Violence	This is a gender-based violence program which uses a toolkit to train health workers from provincial and district hospital centres in Vietnam. This program is in collaboration with the four UN agencies and the Vietnam Ministry of Health. This includes health services and resource provision, gender development, women's representation and participation in decision-making, and infrastructure for the vulnerable population.	Open call	
Philippines	Training in Cervical Cancer Screening via Visual Inspection with Acetic Acid	This program aimed to train and sensitise health workers about cervical cancer and the need for continuous provision of prevention activities like screening to women thus, achieving wider coverage of awareness and screening services.
